POLICY ON DETERMINATION AND DISCLOSURE OF MATERIALITY OF EVENTS AND INFORMATION

1. SCOPE AND APPLICABILITY OF THE POLICY

- 1.1** This Policy on determination and disclosure of materiality of events and information ("**Policy**") of Nivi Trading Limited ("**Company**") has been prepared and adopted in accordance with Regulation 30 of SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 ("**SEBI LODR**") read with amendments made thereunder from time to time, which require every Listed Entity to disclose events or information ("**Events**") which in the opinion of the Board of Directors of the Company are material. The Policy applies in respect of disclosure of material events occurring within the Company as well as with subsidiaries.
- 1.2** "**Fair Disclosure Code**" for the purpose of this Policy shall mean "Code of Practices and Procedures for Fair Disclosure of Unpublished Price Sensitive Information" which is part and parcel of NIVI's "Code of Conduct for Prevention of Insider Trading" as amended from time to time.
- 1.3** Regulation 30 of SEBI LODR prescribes norms for disclosure of Events pertaining to the Listed Entity as under:
- Events specified in Para A of Part A of Schedule III of the SEBI LODR shall be disclosed irrespective of application of materiality thresholds.
 - Events specified in Para B of Part A of Schedule III of the SEBI LODR shall be disclosed subject to meeting materiality thresholds under Regulation 30 (4) of SEBI LODR.
 - Any other event considered Material by the "Authorised Personnel" as defined under Clause 5 of this Policy.

2. OBJECTIVES OF THIS POLICY

- 2.1** To determine materiality of an event or information as required under Regulation 30 (4) and ensure timely, accurate, uniform, and transparent disclosure of all such events or information considered material as per this policy.
- 2.2** Provide a mechanism for: (i) assisting the employees in identifying any potential material event / information; and (ii) reporting the same to the relevant key managerial personnel.

3. MATERIALITY CRITERIA

- 3.1** Materiality of an Event shall be determined on a case-to-case basis depending on specific facts and circumstances relating to it. The omission of an event or information which is likely to result in discontinuity or alteration of event or information already available publicly and / or omission of an event or information which is likely to result in significant market reaction if the said omission came to light at a later date and / or omission of an event or information, whose value or the expected impact in terms of value, exceeds the lower of the following calculated on consolidated financial statements of the Company:
- 3.1.1** **two** percent of **turnover**, as per the last audited consolidated financial statements of the Company;
 - 3.1.2** **two** percent of **net worth**, as per the last audited consolidated financial statements of the Company, except in case the arithmetic value of the net worth is negative;
 - 3.1.3** **five** percent of the average of absolute value of **profit or loss after tax**, as per the last three audited consolidated financial statements of the Company.

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4. TIMELINE FOR DISCLOSURE OF MATERIAL EVENTS OR INFORMATION

The Company shall first disclose to the stock exchange(s) all events or information which are material as soon as reasonably possible and, in any case, not later than the following:

- (i) **thirty minutes** from the closure of the meeting of the Board of Directors in which the decision pertaining to the event or information has been taken.

Provided that in case the meeting of the board of directors closes after normal trading hours of that day but more than three hours before the beginning of the normal trading hours of the next trading day, the listed entity shall disclose the decision pertaining to the event or information, within three hours from the closure of the board meeting:

Provided further that in case the meeting of the board of directors is being held for more than one day, the financial results shall be disclosed within thirty minutes or three hours, as applicable, from closure of such meeting for the day on which it has been considered.

- (ii) **twelve hours** from the occurrence of the event or information in case the event or information is emanating from within the Company.
- (iii) **twenty-four hours** from the occurrence of the event or information in case the event or information is not emanating from within the Company.

However, in respect of claims which are made against the listed entity under any litigation or dispute, other than tax litigation or dispute, the same can be disclosed within seventy-two hours of receipt of the notice by the Company provided details are maintained in Structured Digital Database.

Provided that disclosure with respect to events for which timelines have been specified in Part A of Schedule III of SEBI LODR shall be made within the prescribed timelines.

5. AUTHORISED PERSONNEL

5.1 In compliance with the provisions of Regulation 30(5) of SEBI LODR, the following persons are jointly designated to determine materiality of an event or information in terms of this policy and to make appropriate disclosure to the stock exchanges.

- 5.1.1** Managing Director;
- 5.1.2** Chief Financial Officer; and
- 5.1.3** Company Secretary

5.2 The contact details of the aforesaid authorised personnel will be disclosed to the stock exchanges and shall be displayed on the Company's website.

5.3 The authorised personnel shall ensure the following:

- 5.3.1** Determine the materiality of an event or information for the purpose of making disclosures to Stock Exchanges.
- 5.3.2** Give specific and adequate reply to all queries raised by the stock exchanges with respect to any event or information.
- 5.3.3** To confirm, deny, or clarify any reported material event or information which is not general in nature in the manner as prescribed under SEBI LODR.
- 5.3.4** In case of an ongoing material event or information, make disclosures updating material development on a regular basis, till such time an event is resolved or closed, with relevant explanations.

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- 5.3.5** Determine the appropriate time at which the disclosures are to be made to the stock exchanges, based on an assessment of actual time of occurrence of an event to be reported.
- 5.3.6** To assist relevant employees of the Company in identification of potentially material event / information through regular communications and guidance.
- 5.3.7** Consider such other events that may require disclosure to be made to the stock exchanges which are not explicitly defined in the SEBI LODR and determine the materiality, appropriate time and contents of disclosure for such matters.

6. MECHANISM TO IDENTIFY THE POTENTIAL MATERIAL EVENT AND REPORTING

- 6.1** As required under SEBI LODR, the Company shall follow the mechanism given at **Annexure 1** for:
 - (i) assisting the employees in identifying any potential material event/ information; and
 - (ii) reporting the same to the relevant key managerial personnel.
- 6.2** The Company Secretary in consultation with the Chief Financial Officer shall implement this procedure for ensuing availability of relevant information with Authorised personnel on an immediate basis upon occurrence, with adequate supporting data / information to facilitate a prompt and appropriate disclosure including Event, even if not covered under the SEBI LODR but is potentially of price sensitive nature or non-disclosure of which would result in discontinuity or alteration of publicly available information or is likely to result in a significant market reaction if disclosed at a later date, must also be informed, for further evaluation to the Authorised Person.
- 6.3** Designated Persons shall share the necessary information about the Material Event with Compliance Officer or Chief Financial Officer or Chief Investor Relations Officer appointed as per Company's Fair Disclosure Code to ensure that there is timely and adequate disclosure of Information particularly Unpublished Price Sensitive Information and that is handled on a need-to know basis and shared only for Legitimate Purpose and the same is made available or disseminated to all the investors simultaneously including verifying the rumours reported in mainstream media.

7. REVIEW AND AMENDMENT OF POLICY

- 7.1** The Policy shall be reviewed by the Board as and when any changes are to be incorporated in the Policy due to change in regulations or as may be felt appropriate by the Board.
- 7.2** In case of any subsequent changes in the provisions of the SEBI LODR or any other regulations which makes any of the provisions in the Policy inconsistent with SEBI LODR or any other law, the provisions of the SEBI LODR would prevail over the Policy. Any amendments made in SEBI LODR shall be effective and binding on the Company even if such amendments are not incorporated in the Policy.
- 7.3** For administrative convenience, any change in Policy herein shall be made by the Company Secretary in consultation with the Chief Financial Officer. Any material change that substantially impacts the implementation of the existing Policy shall be approved by the Board.

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ANNEXURE 1

MECHANISM TO IDENTIFY THE POTENTIAL MATERIAL EVENT AND REPORTING OF IT

1. This part of Policy is made as per SEBI LODR which requires that the Company shall provide for:
(i) assisting the employees in identifying any potential material event/ information; and (ii) reporting the same to the relevant key managerial personnel and is applicable to the Employees.
2. Employees for the purpose of this mechanism shall mean and include the persons identified as “Designated Persons” under Company’s “Code of Conduct for Prevention of Insider Trading” as amended from time to time. Such Employees shall communicate the Policy and its requirements to such team members, whose roles are such that they could have first-hand knowledge of any event that would be a Material event for the purpose of this Policy.
3. The list of Events falling under Para A and B of Part A of Schedule III of SEBI LODR are given at Schedule A of this Policy for ready reference and any amendment in the same shall be updated by the Company Secretary from time to time to assist the Employees. Also, the Company Secretary shall on annual basis communicate the Materiality Criteria applicable to Part B Events for a FY as per Clause 3.1 to the Employees.
4. Employees who have the knowledge of potential Event (Para A events where materiality is not applicable and Para B where it is applicable) shall forthwith communicate the same to the CFO, who in turn will do immediate assessment of value of impact and share the same with the board of directors of the Company irrespective of whether it does / does not cross Materiality threshold. CFO shall share the same with Authorised Personnel, and Key Managerial Personnel of the Company who (Authorised Personnel) if necessary in consultation with the Management of the company determine the likely impact on the Company in view of Materiality threshold.
5. Intimation to Stock Exchange shall be given immediately / within given timeline for all the events where such intimation is necessary.
6. Authorised Persons shall record the decision in writing and shall receive updates as regards change/development of an Event for giving necessary updates to the Stock Exchanges, wherever necessary.

Schedule A

Para A – Events where materiality is not applicable

Para B – Events where materiality is applicable

(The above policy was approved by the Board of Directors at its meeting held on 17th May, 2019 and subsequently amended on 07th February 2025)

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Schedule A

Para A: Events which shall be disclosed without any application of the guidelines for materiality as specified in sub-regulation (4) of regulation (30):

1. Acquisition(s) (including agreement to acquire), Scheme of Arrangement (amalgamation, merger, demerger or restructuring), sale or disposal of any unit(s), division(s), whole or substantially the whole of the undertaking(s) or subsidiary of the listed entity, sale of stake in associate company of the listed entity or any other restructuring.

Explanation (1) - For the purpose of this sub-paragraph, the word 'acquisition' shall mean-

- (i) acquiring control, whether directly or indirectly; or
- (ii) acquiring or agreement to acquire shares or voting rights in a company, whether existing or to be incorporated, whether directly or indirectly, such that –
 - (a) the listed entity holds shares or voting rights aggregating to twenty per cent or more of the shares or voting rights in the said company; or
 - (b) there has been a change in holding from the last disclosure made under sub-clause (a) of clause (ii) of the Explanation to this sub-paragraph and such change exceeds five per cent of the total shareholding or voting rights in the said company; or
 - (c) the cost of acquisition or the price at which the shares are acquired exceeds the threshold specified in sub-clause (c) of clause (i) of sub-regulation (4) of regulation 30.

Provided that acquisition of shares or voting rights aggregating to five percent or more of the shares or voting rights in an unlisted company and any change in holding from the last disclosure made under this proviso exceeding two per cent of the total shareholding or voting rights in the said unlisted company shall be disclosed on a quarterly basis to the Stock Exchange in the format as may be specified.

Explanation (2) - For the purpose of this sub-paragraph, “sale or disposal of subsidiary” and “sale of stake in associate company” shall include-

- (i) an agreement to sell or sale of shares or voting rights in a company such that the company ceases to be a wholly owned subsidiary, a subsidiary or an associate company of the listed entity; or
- (ii) an agreement to sell or sale of shares or voting rights in a subsidiary or associate company such that the amount of the sale exceeds the threshold specified in sub-clause (c) of clause (i) of sub-regulation (4) of regulation 30.

Explanation (3)- For the purpose of this sub-paragraph, “undertaking” and “substantially the whole of the undertaking” shall have the same meaning as given under section 180 of the Companies Act, 2013.

2. Issuance or forfeiture of securities, split or consolidation of shares, buyback of securities, any restriction on transferability of securities or alteration in terms or structure of existing securities including forfeiture, reissue of forfeited securities, alteration of calls, redemption of securities etc.
3. New Rating(s) or Revision in Rating(s).
4. Outcome of Meetings of the board of directors: The listed entity shall disclose to the Exchange(s), the outcome of meetings of the board of directors, held to consider the following:
 - a) dividends recommended or declared or the decision to pass any dividend and the date on which dividend shall be paid/dispatched;
 - b) any cancellation of dividend with reasons thereof;
 - c) the decision on buyback of securities;
 - d) the decision with respect to fund raising proposed to be undertaken including by way of issue of securities (excluding security receipts, securitized debt instruments or money market instruments regulated by the Reserve Bank of India), through further public offer, rights issue, American Depository Receipts/ Global Depository Receipts/ Foreign Currency Convertible Bonds, qualified institutions placement, debt issue, preferential issue or any other method

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- e) increase in capital by issue of bonus shares through capitalization including the date on which such bonus shares shall be credited/dispatched;
- f) reissue of forfeited shares or securities, or the issue of shares or securities held in reserve for future issue or the creation in any form or manner of new shares or securities or any other rights, privileges or benefits to subscribe to;
- g) short particulars of any other alterations of capital, including calls;
- h) financial results;
- i) decision on voluntary delisting by the listed entity from stock exchange(s):

Provided that in case the meeting of the board of directors closes after normal trading hours of that day but more than three hours before the beginning of the normal trading hours of the next trading day, the listed entity shall disclose the decision pertaining to the event or information, within three hours from the closure of the board meeting:

Provided further that in case the meeting of the board of directors is being held for more than one day, the financial results shall be disclosed within thirty minutes or three hours, as applicable, from closure of such meeting for the day on which it has been considered.

(Normal trading hours shall mean time-period for which the recognized stock exchanges are open for trading for all investors)

5. Agreements (viz. shareholder agreement(s), joint venture agreement(s), family settlement agreement(s) (to the extent that it impacts management and control of the listed entity), agreement(s)/treaty(ies)/contract(s) with media companies) which are binding and not in normal course of business, revision(s) or amendment(s) and termination(s) thereof.

(5A) Agreements entered into by the shareholders, promoters, promoter group entities, related parties, directors, key managerial personnel, employees of the listed entity or of its holding, subsidiary or associate company, among themselves or with the listed entity or with a third party, solely or jointly, which, either directly or indirectly or potentially or whose purpose and effect is to, impact the management or control of the listed entity or impose any restriction or create any liability upon the listed entity, shall be disclosed to the Stock Exchanges, including disclosure of any rescission, amendment or alteration of such agreements thereto, whether or not the listed entity is a party to such agreements:

Provided that such agreements entered into by a listed entity in the normal course of business shall not be required to be disclosed unless they, either directly or indirectly or potentially or whose purpose and effect is to, impact the management or control of the listed entity or they are required to be disclosed in terms of any other provisions of these regulations.

Explanation: For the purpose of this clause, the term "directly or indirectly" includes agreements creating obligation on the parties to such agreements to ensure that listed entity shall or shall not act in a particular manner.

6. Fraud or defaults by a listed entity, its promoter, director, key managerial personnel, senior management or subsidiary or arrest of key managerial personnel, senior management, promoter or director of the listed entity, whether occurred within India or abroad:

For the purpose of this sub-paragraph:

- (i) 'Fraud' shall include fraud as defined under Regulation 2(1)(c) of Securities and Exchange Board of India (Prohibition of Fraudulent and Unfair Trade Practices relating to Securities Market) Regulations, 2003.
- (ii) 'Default' shall mean non-payment of the interest or principal amount in full on the date when the debt has become due and payable.

Explanation 1- In case of revolving facilities like cash credit, an entity would be considered to be in 'default' if the outstanding balance remains continuously in excess of the sanctioned limit or drawing power, whichever is lower, for more than thirty days.

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Explanation 2- Default by a promoter, director, key managerial personnel, senior management, subsidiary shall mean default which has or may have an impact on the listed entity.

Explanation 3 – Fraud by senior management, other than who is promoter, director or key managerial personnel, shall be required to be disclosed only if it is in relation to the listed entity.

7. Change in directors, key managerial personnel (Managing Director, Chief Executive Officer, Chief Financial Officer, Company Secretary etc.), senior management, Auditor and Compliance Officer.

(7A) In case of resignation of the auditor of the listed entity, detailed reasons for resignation of auditor, as given by the said auditor, shall be disclosed by the listed entities to the stock exchanges as soon as possible but not later than twenty-four hours of receipt of such reasons from the auditor.

(7B) Resignation of independent director including reasons for resignation: In case of resignation of an independent director of the listed entity, within seven days from the date of resignation, the following disclosures shall be made to the stock exchanges by the listed entities:

- i. The letter of resignation along with detailed reasons for the resignation as given by the said director.
 - (ia). Names of listed entities in which the resigning director holds directorships, indicating the category of directorship and membership of board committees, if any.
- ii. The independent director shall, along with the detailed reasons, also provide a confirmation that there is no other material reasons other than those provided.
- iii. The confirmation as provided by the independent director above shall also be disclosed by the listed entities to the stock exchanges along with the disclosures as specified in sub-clause (i) and (ii) above.

(7C) In case of resignation of key managerial personnel, senior management, Compliance Officer or director other than an independent director; the letter of resignation along with detailed reasons for the resignation as given by the key managerial personnel, senior management, Compliance Officer or director shall be disclosed to the stock exchanges by the listed entities within seven days from the date that such resignation comes into effect.

(7D) In case the Managing Director or Chief Executive Officer of the listed entity was indisposed or unavailable to fulfil the requirements of the role in a regular manner for more than forty five days in any rolling period of ninety days, the same along with the reasons for such indisposition or unavailability, shall be disclosed to the stock exchange(s).

8. Appointment or discontinuation of share transfer agent.

9. Resolution plan/ Restructuring in relation to loans/borrowings from banks/financial institutions including the following details:

- (i) Decision to initiate resolution of loans/borrowings;
- (ii) Signing of Inter-Creditors Agreement (ICA) by lenders;
- (iii) Finalization of Resolution Plan;
- (iv) Implementation of Resolution Plan;
- (v) Salient features, not involving commercial secrets, of the resolution/ restructuring plan as decided by lenders.

10. One time settlement with a bank.

11. Winding-up petition filed by any party / creditors.

12. Issuance of Notices, call letters, resolutions and circulars sent to shareholders, debenture holders or creditors or any class of them or advertised in the media by the listed entity.

13. Proceedings of Annual and extraordinary general meetings of the listed entity.

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14. Amendments to memorandum and articles of association of listed entity, in brief.
15. (a) (i) Schedule of analysts or institutional investors meet at least two working days in advance (excluding the date of the intimation and the date of the meet)
Explanation I: For the purpose of this clause 'meet' shall mean group meetings or group conference calls conducted physically or through digital means.
- (ii) Presentations prepared by the listed entity for analysts or institutional investors meet, post earnings or quarterly calls shall be disclosed to the recognized stock exchanges prior to beginning of such events.
- Explanation II: Disclosure of names in the schedule of analysts or institutional investors meet shall be optional for the listed entity.
- (b) Audio or video recordings if any, and transcripts of post earnings or quarterly calls, by whatever name called, conducted physically or through digital means, in the following manner
- (i) The audio recordings shall be promptly made available on the website and in any case, before the next trading day or within twenty-four hours from the conclusion of such calls, whichever is earlier;
- (ii) the video recordings, if any, shall be made available on the website within forty-eight hours from the conclusion of such calls;
- (iii) the transcripts of such calls shall be made available on the website along with simultaneous submission to recognized stock exchanges within five working days of the conclusion of such calls.
16. The following events in relation to the corporate insolvency resolution process (CIRP) of a listed corporate debtor under the Insolvency Code:
- a) Filing of application by the corporate applicant for initiation of CIRP, also specifying the amount of default;
 - b) Filing of application by financial creditors for initiation of CIRP against the corporate debtor, also specifying the amount of default;
 - c) Admission of application by the Tribunal, along with amount of default or rejection or withdrawal, as applicable ;
 - d) Public announcement made pursuant to order passed by the Tribunal under section 13 of Insolvency Code;
 - e) List of creditors as required to be displayed by the corporate debtor under regulation 13(2)(c) of the IBBI (Insolvency Resolution Process for Corporate Persons) Regulations, 2016;
 - f) Appointment/ Replacement of the Resolution Professional;
 - g) Prior or post-facto intimation of the meetings of Committee of Creditors;
 - h) Brief particulars of invitation of resolution plans under section 25(2)(h) of Insolvency Code in the Form specified under regulation 36A(5) of the IBBI (Insolvency Resolution Process for Corporate Persons) Regulations, 2016;
 - i) Number of resolution plans received by Resolution Professional;
 - j) Filing of resolution plan with the Tribunal;
 - k) Approval of resolution plan by the Tribunal or rejection, if applicable;
 - l) Specific features and details of the resolution plan as approved by the Adjudicating Authority under the Insolvency Code, not involving commercial secrets, including details such as:
 - (i) Pre and Post net-worth of the company;
 - (ii) Details of assets of the company post CIRP;
 - (iii) Details of securities continuing to be imposed on the companies' assets;
 - (iv) Other material liabilities imposed on the company;
 - (v) Detailed pre and post shareholding pattern assuming 100% conversion of convertible securities;
 - (vi) Details of funds infused in the company, creditors paid-off;
 - (vii) Additional liability on the incoming investors due to the transaction, source of such funding etc.
 - (viii) Impact on the investor – revised P/E, RONW ratios etc.;

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- (ix) Names of the new promoters, key managerial personnel, if any and their past experience in the business or employment. In case where promoters are companies, history of such company and names of natural persons in control;
- (x) Brief description of business strategy.

- m) Any other material information not involving commercial secrets.
- n) Proposed steps to be taken by the incoming investor/acquirer for achieving the MPS;
- o) Quarterly disclosure of the status of achieving the MPS;
- p) The details as to the delisting plans, if any approved in the resolution plan.

17. Initiation of Forensic audit: In case of initiation of forensic audit, (by whatever name called), the following disclosures shall be made to the stock exchanges by listed entities:

- a) The fact of initiation of forensic audit along-with name of entity initiating the audit and reasons for the same, if available;
- b) Final forensic audit report (other than for forensic audit initiated by regulatory / enforcement agencies) on receipt by the listed entity along with comments of the management, if any.

Explanation – For the purpose of this sub-paragraph, forensic audit refers to the audits, by whatever name called, which are initiated with the objective of detecting any mis-statement in financial statements, mis-appropriation, siphoning or diversion of funds and does not include audit of matters such as product quality control practices, manufacturing practices, recruitment practices, supply chain process including procurement or other similar matters that would not require any revision to the financial statements disclosed by the listed entity.

18. Announcement or communication through social media intermediaries or mainstream media by directors, promoters, key managerial personnel or senior management of a listed entity, in relation to any event or information which is material for the listed entity in terms of regulation 30 of these regulations and is not already made available in the public domain by the listed entity.

Explanation – “social media intermediaries” shall have the same meaning as defined under the Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules, 2021.

19. Action(s) initiated or orders passed by any regulatory, statutory, enforcement authority or judicial body against the listed entity or its directors, key managerial personnel, senior management, promoter or subsidiary, in relation to the listed entity, in respect of the following:

- a) search or seizure; or
- b) re-opening of accounts under section 130 of the Companies Act, 2013; or
- c) investigation under the provisions of Chapter XIV of the Companies Act, 2013;

along with the following details pertaining to the actions(s) initiated, taken or orders passed:

- i. name of the authority;
- ii. nature and details of the action(s) taken, initiated or order(s) passed;
- iii. date of receipt of direction or order, including any ad-interim or interim orders, or any other communication from the authority;
- iv. details of the violation(s)/contravention(s) committed or alleged to be committed;
- v. impact on financial, operation or other activities of the listed entity, quantifiable in monetary terms to the extent possible.

20. Action(s) taken or orders passed by any regulatory, statutory, enforcement authority or judicial body against the listed entity or its directors, key managerial personnel, senior management, promoter or subsidiary, in relation to the listed entity, in respect of the following:

- (a) suspension;
- (b) imposition of fine or penalty;
- (c) settlement of proceedings;
- (d) debarment;
- (e) disqualification;
- (f) closure of operations;
- (g) sanctions imposed;

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(h) warning or caution; or

(i) any other similar action(s) by whatever name called;

along with the following details pertaining to the actions(s) initiated, taken or orders passed:

- i. name of the authority;
- ii. nature and details of the action(s) taken, initiated or order(s) passed;
- iii. date of receipt of direction or order, including any ad-interim or interim orders, or any other communication from the authority;
- iv. details of the violation(s)/contravention(s) committed or alleged to be committed;
- v. impact on financial, operation or other activities of the listed entity, quantifiable in monetary terms to the extent possible.

Explanation – Imposition of fine or penalty shall be disclosed in the following manner along with the details pertaining to the action(s) taken or orders passed as mentioned in the sub-paragraph:

i. disclosure of fine or penalty of rupees one lakh or more imposed by sectoral regulator or enforcement agency and fine or penalty of rupees ten lakhs or more imposed by other authority or judicial body shall be disclosed within twenty-four hours.

ii. disclosure of fine or penalty imposed which are lower than the monetary thresholds specified in the clause (i) above on a quarterly basis in the format as may be specified.

21. Voluntary revision of financial statements or the report of the board of directors of the listed entity under section 131 of the Companies Act, 2013.

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Para B: Events which shall be disclosed upon application of the guidelines for materiality referred sub-regulation (4) of regulation (30):

1. Commencement or any postponement in the date of commencement of commercial production or commercial operations of any unit/division.
2. Any of the following events pertaining to the listed entity:
 - (a) arrangements for strategic, technical, manufacturing, or marketing tie-up; or
 - (b) adoption of new line(s) of business; or
 - (c) closure of operation of any unit, division or subsidiary (in entirety or in piecemeal).
3. Capacity addition or product launch.
4. Awarding, bagging/ receiving, amendment or termination of awarded/bagged orders/contracts not in the normal course of business.
5. Agreements (viz. loan agreement(s) or any other agreement(s) which are binding and not in normal course of business) and revision(s) or amendment(s) or termination(s) thereof.
6. Disruption of operations of any one or more units or division of the listed entity due to natural calamity (earthquake, flood, fire etc.), force majeure or events such as strikes, lockouts etc.
7. Effect(s) arising out of change in the regulatory framework applicable to the listed entity.
8. Pendency of any litigation(s) or dispute(s) or the outcome thereof which may have an impact on the listed entity.

Provided that if all the relevant information, in respect of claims which are made against the Company under any litigation or dispute, other than tax litigation or dispute, is maintained in the structured digital database of the Company in terms of provisions of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Prohibition of Insider Trading) Regulations, 2015, the disclosure with respect to such claims shall be made to the stock exchange(s) within seventy-two hours of receipt of the notice by the Company.

Explanation - Tax litigations or disputes, including demand notices, penalties, etc., shall be disclosed under sub-para 8 of Para B based on application of criteria for materiality in the following manner:

- (i) Disclosure of new tax litigations or disputes within twenty-four hours from the receipt of notice by the listed entity.
- (ii) Quarterly updates on ongoing tax litigations or disputes in the format as may be specified.
- (iii) Tax litigations or disputes, the outcomes of which are likely to have a high correlation, should be cumulated for determining materiality.

9. Frauds or defaults by employees of the listed entity which has or may have an impact on the listed entity.
10. Options to purchase securities including any ESOP/ESPS Scheme.
11. Giving of guarantees or indemnity or becoming a surety by whatever named called, for any third party.
12. Granting, withdrawal, surrender, cancellation or suspension of key licenses or regulatory approvals.
13. Delay or default in the payment of fines, penalties, dues, etc. to any regulatory, statutory, enforcement or judicial authority.
